The highlight of the School of Practical Ministry was truly the missions trip to Nicaragua and the closeness and bonding that comes with sitting together at Jesus' feet. Interestingly, another student on the missions team, David L., had been in one of my online courses. And there we were, ministering together in Nicaragua!

Just four weeks after graduation, my journey brought me to Colorado to begin Charis's third-year Business School. The business program was incredible.
